# **Municipal Notes**

#### **COUNCIL NEWS**

We hope you and your family get a chance to enjoy the COVID friendly outdoor activities that our area has to offer. Family day is on February 21<sup>st</sup>, a great day to get outside and spend some quality time with your family. We'd like to thank all residents for cooperating with COVID-19 lockdown requirements and taking the safety measurements seriously to keep everyone safe. Although tough, we hope it is our last lockdown and we can slowly integrate back into our normal routines.

Mentioned in the December Messenger was the harvesting of trees at the Machin Airport due to the Pine Budworm devastation; we are happy to say we received upwards of \$50,000 now that the harvesting is complete. This money will be allocated to an Economic Development Fund which will be used to advance economic opportunities for the Municipality. With many development grants still pending, this fund will be used towards covering the Municipality's portion to carry out the potential projects.

Our Mayor, Council, Clerk Treasurer, and EDO participated in the KDMA virtual conference on January 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>. Presentations from the Northwestern Health Unit, KDSB, and the Kenora District Homes for the Aged were all on the first day of the conference. Each talked about the current status of projects and future outlooks for the district. Minister Rickford, Minister Clarke, Associate Minister Tibollo, and Minister Sylvia Jones were all present for the second day of the conference and took the time to talk with KDMA members as well as answer questions about our issues we face in Northwestern Ontario. We'd like to thank the city of Dryden for virtually hosting the event and putting together all the informative presentations on both days.

Council and Staff have created a new Volunteer Recognition Policy for our community. The new policy will recognize volunteers and/or community groups for the hard work they have done to better the community. We are looking for members of the community who are interested in being a part of the new Volunteer Selection Committee. For a short period of time each year, members of the Committee will be responsible for reviewing volunteer nomination forms and determining the most suitable winner for each award. If you are interested, have questions, or would like more information on the com-

mittee or the policy procedure, please contact a member of Council and/or municipal office employee.

#### **Economic Development**

I unfortunately have to start off with bad news. We were declined by the Ontario Trillium Foundation for fitness and playground equipment to be installed at the Pine Tree Park waterfront. Disappointing, but we will continue to pursue this project as more funding becomes available.

The government started the Northern Ontario Resource Development Support Fund which is strictly for northern municipalities to use for certain resource development impacts. This is a five-year program where our Municipality will be given \$74,636 each year to put towards projects that pertain to resource development. We have applied for our funds from year 1, 2, and part of year 3 to go towards the costs of the major construction repairs and engineering work that took place at the Cascade Bridge this summer/fall.

A website design has been approved and our new website is officially in the development stages. We cannot confirm a timeline but hope to have the new site up and running sometime in March. When the website is completed, it will feature our promotional video which was shot in July of 2021. We will be releasing the completed video with our new website to try and promote the area and the businesses involved. With your support and the support of other organizations, we hope to see the video reach a large variety of viewers.

The cost is **\$10.00 per person** to ride to and from Dryden on Tuesday or Thursday. Should you have mobility issues both getting on and off the bus or shopping and carrying your items, you will have to bring along a companion.

You do not have to be a senior to use this service. Any adult can ride, however seniors do come first for this service.

Feb Stay Alert, Slow Down and Stay in Control - The Three Key Elements of Safe Winter Driving

What should you do before winter driving, especially when a longer distance? Be Prepared!

Make sure your vehicle is mechanically ready.

Keep a welf-stocked winter survival kit in your vehicle.

Have warm winter clothing and boots in your vehicle in case you become stranded.

Let someone know of your destination and expected time of arrival.

Check weather and road conditions before heading out. You may need to allow yourself extra time for travel, or wait until conditions improve.

Ensure fuel tank is sufficiently full.

How should you drive in winter weather? Slow down!

Always exercise caution and drive according to highway and weather conditions.

Be alert. "Black ice" is invisible. Black ice will make a road look like shiny new asphalt. Pavement should look grey-white in winter.

- Do not use cruise control. Loss of grip on ice can cause your car to accelerate if using cruise control. Winter driving requires you to be in full control at all times.
- Reduce your speed while approaching intersections covered with ice or snow.
- Drive with low-beam headlights on. Not only are they brighter than daytime running lights but turning them on also activates the tail lights which makes your vehicle more visible.
- Lengthen your following distance behind the vehicle ahead of you. Stopping distance on an icy road is double that of stopping on a dry one.
- Steer with smooth and precise movements. Avoid sudden turns of steering wheel and abrupt braking or accelerating as these can cause skidding.
- Be aware and slow down when you see a sign warning that you are approaching a bridge. Bridges are likely to be icy even when there is no ice on the ground surface, (because bridges over open air freeze faster and stay frozen longer than roads which tend to be insulated somewhat by solid ground.)
- Be patient and pass other cars only when it is safe to do so.
   Keep a safe distance back from snow plows.

What should you do if you get stuck or stranded in the snow? Don't panic!

- Avoid over-exertion and over-exposure to the cold. Cold weather can put extra stress on the heart and contribute to the hazards of over-exertion. Sweaty clothes next to the skin are not good insulators against the cold, increasing how cold you feel. Change into dry clothes where possible.
- Stay in the car for safety and warmth Do not leave the car for assistance unless help is very close and it is safe to walk. It is easy to get disoriented in a blizzard.
- Turn on flashing lights or set up flares.
- Run the car engine occasionally (about 10 minutes every hour) to provide heat (and to conserve fuel). Ensure that the tail exhaust pipe is free of snow and keep the window opened slightly (on the side shielded from the wind) to prevent the build up of carbon monoxide when the engine is running.
- Bundle up in a blanket. If there is more than one person in the car, share two people sharing blankets will be warmer than either person alone in a blanket.
- Wear a hat and scarf the head and neck are major sources of heat loss from the body.
- Monitor for any signs of frostbite and hypothermia.
- Do not fall asleep. If there is more than one person in the car, take turns sleeping.
  - Do not stay in one position too long. Do some exercises to help the circulation move arms and legs, clap your hands, etc.

We started the New Year with great hopes to welcome our students back in class! Unfortunately, virtual learning was mandated for the first 2 weeks this month. Technology is a wonderful thing, but to have students walking in the hallways, chatting, playing outside, and socializing in person, no level of technology can compensate for this. Now that we are back for in school learning, we hope to remain in this position.

The last month of 2021, students in Grades 4 to 8 participated with "Dairy Farmers of Ontario's (DFO) SICK KIDS CAMPAIGN! Each one wrote a Christmas Wish and positive message to a child / parent/ caregiver / Essential Care Worker, who was either too ill to be home or had to work during the holidays. The cards were distributed to Children's Hospitals in Hamilton, Ottawa, Toronto and Montreal. In addition, a donation of \$ 500.000 was made by DFO to the Sick Kids Foundation. Provincially, over 6,500 cards were collected and at least 100 of them came from our area schools.

We submitted our photo collages of this project to be entered in "Grain Farmer's of Ontario's "What's your Food Story?" visual arts contest. If we are chosen as a winner of art supplies, is not yet determined.

We are grateful for being the recipient of a big variety of hats, mitts and neck warmers. There is always a high demand for dry mitts! THANK YOU very much to our Community members, Mrs. Parsons, Scott and Karen Skene of Skene Lumber for their donation of new warm socks from their Aunt Alta's Sock Program. The Skene's donated 50 pairs of socks to the school so we can make sure that all of our students have warm, dry socks to wear during these cold winter months

Our school signed up with <u>Ontario's "Bee Science" Club</u>. Towards the spring we will be able to watch virtual apiary activities and learn more about bees from an apiarist (Bee Farmer). Without bees and other pollinators we would only have 1/3 of fruits and vegetables on the supermarket shelves, and not considering all the By-Products made from F&V! Hoping, we can learn on how to enhance habitats, and recognition of pollinators' contribution to our lives.


February is Heart Month, a time to bring attention to the importance of cardiovascular health, and what we can to reduce our risk of cardiovascular disease.


