BY-LAW NUMBER 15-2013

BEING A BY-LAW TO PROVIDE FOR LICENCING, REGULATING AND GOVERNING OF TRANSIENT TRADERS.

AND

BEING A BY-LAW TO RESCIND BY-LAW NUMBER 664-83

Whereas pursuant to the Municipal Act, 2001, S.O. 2001, c.25, Section 150-162, the Council of a local municipality may pass by-laws to licence, regulate and govern transient traders, refreshment vehicles and other persons whose names have not been entered on the assessment role in respect of a commercial assessment for the current year, and who offer goods, wares and merchandise for sale in any manner;

NOW THEREFORE THE CORPORATION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF MACHIN ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. In this By-law, "Transient Traders" includes:

Transient traders and other persons whose names have not been entered on the assessment roles in respect to commercial assessment for the current year, and who offer goods, wares or merchandise for sale in any manner.

- 2. Application must be made to the Municipality of Machin, the application must include a full description of the goods, wares or merchandise that the applicant proposes to sell or offer for sale under such licence.
- 3. The fee for such licence shall be the sum of \$300.00 paid to the Municipality of Machin.
- 4. Every such licence, shall be for the current year at the time of issuance therefore shall expire on the 31st day of December of the current year.
- 5. Every transient trader who carries on business without a licence shall be guilty of an offence and shall incur a penalty equal to the licence fee which should have been (\$300.00) paid and in addition thereto the sum of not less than \$10.00 and not more than \$200.00, such penalty and costs to be recoverable under Provincial Offences Act. R.S.O. 1980 Chapter 400 and amendments thereto.
- 6. Every transient trader shall permanently display his licence at his place of business.

READ a FIRST, SECOND and THIRD time, and FINALLY passed this 8th day of April 2013.
