## **COUNCIL NEWS:**

Many families were enjoying the great weather in February participating in the 54<sup>th</sup> Annual Kin Karnival and Lions Poker Derby. We hope you had a chance to enjoy the local activities.

Mayor and Council representatives participated in the Annual Kenora District Municipal Association (KDMA) meetings in Sioux Lookout January 30 to February 1. It was an excellent opportunity to meet other municipal leaders in the region to discuss Municipal issues. The conference theme this year was around Climate Change. There was excellent information on weather data from across Canada and in our region illustrating the noticeable increase in temperatures from the 1950's and the greater frequency of major storms and disasters. Individuals and Municipalities need to be more prepared for significant weather events through planning and preparedness.

Mayor Gord Griffiths participated in the 2020 Ontario Budget Consultation discussions held in Kenora February 3 along with other Mayors and CAO'S. The Hon. Rod Phillips Minister of Finance and Kenora MPP Greg Rickford where present for the discussions. Mayor Gord was able to present our Municipality's continued concerns over small municipalities continuing to receive Provincial funding as a necessity to deliver adequate service to our citizens. Concern over the high costs of hydro and how it affects small communities was also discussed i.e. arena costs.

Councillors Dennis Peterson and Garry Parks participated in the regional roundtable sessions on Wednesday February 12<sup>th</sup> in Kenora for municipalities and band councils providing an overview the proposed legislative changes under the Community Safety and Policing Act, 2019 (CSPA,2019) related to the Ontario Provincial Police (OPP). The sessions discussed matters relating to regulations such as: OPP Detachment Boards and OPP Governance Advisory Council. Mayor Gord Griffiths was in Kenora on the same day participating in the 2020 Federal Pre-Budget consultations with the Hon. Mona Fortier Minister of Middle Class Prosperity and the Associate Minister of Finance with discussions on how the government can continue to make life more affordable, strengthen and grow the middle class.

Council and Municipal Staff have completed a review of the draft 2020 Municipal budget. An open public meeting to review the finalized budget will be announced and held prior, to Councils' approval at a General meeting.

### Financial:

Of the total Municipal tax revenue collected each year, Financial Downloads from the provincial government take up a large portion of each tax dollar collected. In 2019 download payments totalled \$704,731 or 38% of our total Municipal tax revenue of \$1,852,858. This included Policing (OPP) costs @ \$215,521 (31%); Northwest Health Unit (NWHU) @ \$45,039 (6%); Home for the Aged @ \$143,810 (20%); Kenora District Service Board (KDSB) \$300,361 (43%). This left our Municipality with \$0.62 of each tax dollar collected to manage our infrastructure including 88 kms of roads, 4 bridges, Fire Department, 2 Landfills, Woodland Arena, Eagle River Recreation Centre and rink, Buildings, vehicles, machinery, equipment parks etc. Municipalities in Ontario have limited control on regional and provincial download costs, this is why it is so important for all municipalities to voice their concerns individually and collectively with provincial Officials and Ministers whenever possible.
