COUNCIL NEWS

It doesn't seem the snow is ready to leave us quite yet,. Eager to get outside and enjoy all the recreational activities our area has to offer, we must continue to be patient. The Municipality is especially excited to see what recreational opportunities await in the future. Recently notified, the Municipality was made aware that we have been approved for funding to hire a Recreational Facilitator for a one-year contract in hopes of better utilizing our many recreation buildings/assets.

April was a busy month for Mayor and Council, especially at the month's end. The April 25th council meeting had the 2022 budget presented and finalized. The 2022 budget saw a 2% increase to keep up with the increased downloading costs from the government of Ontario. While we realize this is not ideal, we feel it is fair given the circumstances and are optimistic our current projects will have a positive effect on future budgets.

Mayor Gordon Griffiths, Councillor Dennis Peterson, and Councillor Garry Parkes all participated at the 2022 NOMA conference in Fort Frances between April 27th-29th. This conference provided a great chance for Mayor and Council members to have one-on-one conversations with key stakeholders in Ontario. Being able to establish strong relationships with government officials and other municipal members of government has provided great success for our Municipality in the past.

Some residents may have noticed; surveying for the CP property located on Spruce St has finally begun. Finalization of the land transaction will occur in the beginning of summer; Council is happy to see this deal being close to complete after pursuing this property for years.

We are happy to say the municipal office will now be open again to the public starting on May 2^{nd} . Regular council meetings will once again be held at 7pm at the municipal office so that more residents can attend.

Finally, we'd like to extend a big thank you to Hydro One for hearing our concerns about the scheduled power outage on the morning of April 24th and deciding to reschedule the outage. We were concerned with the heavy rainfall and the affect the power outage would have on sump-pumps for our area. I travelled to the NDMNRF office in Dryden on April 27th to discuss our many ongoing projects with the Ministry. Our goal is to have our Vermilion Bay cemetery expansion project completed by the end of this year. A project we've been working on since April of last year, we have been waiting on a decision after our request to acquire the land for less than market value. Mentioned in previous Messengers, we are still working on the Ely Lake project and are now part of a pilot project to help streamline the process.

It was exciting to see our grant was approved to hire a Recreational Facilitator for a one-year contract with funding also being given to the Municipality for yoga classes, art classes, and sporting equipment. We still await decisions on other grants that we have submitted; capitalizing on funding opportunities is essential for us if we wish to improve our services.

Finally, I'd like to touch base on the status of our new municipal website. We are still waiting for the development to be complete; as frustrating as it is for everyone, we are remaining patient with the developers during their working process. Please stay tuned for the release date in May, still to be determined.

Public Works:

The weather has not made it easy on our Public Works department, they will continue to get out and fix bad spots on the roads but have been set back so far by the weather. We'd like to welcome Daniel Langlais to the team as a part-time equipment operator. Daniel brings years of experience and knowledge to our crew and will be of great assistance to our municipality.

Woodland Arena:

Woodland Arena is now closing for the summer; I would like to thank all that came out and supported our arena this past year. We had a slow start, but as the COVID pandemic subsided we gained more people. It's been a hard 3 years, but we seem to finally see the light at the end of the tunnel.

I hope to see you all next fall; hockey will be back, figure skating, AA hockey teams, High School Hockey, and the Lillian Berg School as well. This past year we received a grant from the Northern Ontario Heritage Fund Corporation. I'd like to thank everyone involved for their help in acquiring this funding. This grant was used to upgrade the ice plant, install LED lights, add puck board to the outer lining of the rink, insert new flooring (walkway, canteen, dressing rooms), and install the REALice water system which is the only of its kind in northwestern Ontario. Upgrades to the ice plant, installation of the REALice water system, and the installing of new LED lights will all lead to energy savings as well as environmental benefits for the Municipality. We hope that people will come out and see the improvements, there is still more to come, for example, we are considering adding a ramp to make our front door more handicap accessible.

This summer we are looking into the possibility of adding beach volleyball to our area as well as what upgrades are needed for our baseball diamond after two years of limited use. Garage sales are going to be taking place again this summer. if you're looking to rent a table or donate, please get a hold of me at 807-227-2833 or 807-216-8756.

At the end of the day, I want the community and tourists to enjoy everything that we have to offer. We have one of the best arenas around, lets continue this venture so that all can enjoy. In closing, I want to thank Mayor, Council, and municipal staff for helping and seeing our bright future.

- **HOW:** Sign-up/Contact sheet, Safety flyer and Garbage bags can be picked up at the Municipal Office from Monday May 9th to Friday the 13th during regular office hours 8 a.m. - 4 p.m., as well on Saturday May 14th from 8 a.m. - 1 p.m. at volunteer tables setup at the Vermilion Bay Fire Hall and Eagle River Fire Hall. At the same locations pick-up a Safety Flyer with safety tips to help keep us safe while participating in this volunteer initiative.
- Pick-up garbage bags (supplied by the Municipality) for municipal roads (black bags for garbage & clear bags for recycle material). Heavy black bags are supplied by Emcon for cleaning numbered highways (please limit # of bags you take based on what you will fill)
- For volunteers who plan to participate but may not need supplies from the pick-up locations we ask that you contact the Municipal Office ph. 227-2633 or email at <u>deputyclerk@visitmachin.com</u> so we can get a better account of how many are participating.


- The Municipality has granted permission to bring these bags to the landfill with no charge. Volunteers can drop their bags off at the Municipal Landfills that are open or leave them on the road edges for pickup by volunteers or the Public Works Department. Emcon will pick-up along the numbered highways (heavy black bags).
- We encourage volunteers to recycle where possible to help extend the life of our landfills (clear bags). Crush recycle material as much as possible to optimize Blue Box space at the landfills. Clear bags containing recycle material can be deposited directing into the recycle bins at the landfills, any black bags containing recycle material must be emptied into the recycle bins. Where possible separate aluminum pop and beer tins, and beer bottles for a possible refund deposit that can be donated to a local cause (If volunteers feel safe doing so)
- Please make sure your bags are visible along the roads but well off the road to make sure they are not impeding the flow of traffic
- If your bags are not picked up by Tuesday May 17th, please contact the Municipal Office to ensure they are removed

Frozen Water Services Information for Property Owners Whose Responsibility is it?



Under the Ontario Building Code, all the water service lines in your building, and the Property Owner Water Service Line, which extends into your building, are defined as "plumbing".

Legally, the Municipality only has jurisdiction and responsibility for the "Water Distribution System", which is defined under Ontario Regulation 170/03 – Drinking Water Systems, as including the watermains, appurtenances (i.e. fire hydrants, valves, sampling stations) and "service connections". Only the line from the watermain, up to and including the curb stop is the municipality responsibility. The property owner is responsible from the curb stop up to and including the plumbing in the house.

Property Owners in Vermilion Bay with Aqua Flow units are reminded to turn them on to prevent your water from freezing.



Emergency Preparedness Week – May 1 to 7: Be Ready for Anything

Natural disasters may be beyond our control, but there are ways to reduce the risk and the impact of whatever emergency we might face.

Emergency Preparedness Week encourages Canadians to take concrete actions to be better prepared to protect themselves and their families during emergencies. This special week is a national effort lead by Public Safety Canada, provincial and territorial emergency management organizations, Indigenous or-ganizations, non-governmental organizations, and private sector.

Experience has shown that individual preparedness goes a long way to help people cope better - both during and after a major disaster. By taking a few simple steps, you can become better prepared to face a range of emergencies. It is important to:

Know the risks – Although the consequences of disasters can be similar, knowing the risks specific to our community and our region can help you better prepare.

• Make a plan – It will help you and your family know what to do. Plans should include emergency numbers, important documents, and utility shut-off procedures.

Get an emergency kit – During an emergency, we will all need some basic supplies. We may need to get by without power or tap water. Be prepared to be self-sufficient for at least 72 hours in an emergency. Emergency kits should include non-perishable food and manual can opener, water, medication/medical supplies, flashlight, radio, extra batteries, first-aid kit, candles and matches/ lighter, hand sanitizer, extra car keys, cash, whistle, any other items specific to your household's needs. Kits should be checked and refreshed twice a year.

Using Technology During a Disaster

We rely on technology more and more to keep in touch with our family, friends, and colleagues with a click of a button. But what happens in the event of a major emergency? Suddenly these tools can become vital in helping you and your family deal get in touch and stay informed. So here are some tips on the use of technology in an emergency:

If possible, **use non-voice channels like text messaging, email or social media**. These use less bandwidth than voice communications and may work even when phone service doesn't.

• If you must use a phone, **keep your conversation brief** and convey only vital information to emergency personnel and/or family. This will also conserve your phone's battery.

• Unable to complete a call? **Wait 10 seconds before redialing** to help reduce network congestion. Note, cordless phones rely on electricity and will not work during a power outage. If you have a landline, keep at least one corded phone in your home.

• Keep a charger for your mobile device in your emergency kit. Consider getting a solar-powered charger.

- Keep your contacts up to date.
- Save your safe meeting location(s) on your phone's mapping application.

Conserve your smartphone's battery by reducing the screen's brightness, placing your phone in airplane mode, and closing apps you are not using. You never know how long a power outage will last!

We learned about garbage and how long many items will stay in our landfills as activities during the week for "Earth Day", on Friday, April 22nd.






